The Henley Football and Netball Club continues to grow and flourish offering community-based sport for over a thousand players ranging in age from seven years to sixty plus. We can certainly be proud of the successes the Club has had in 2023. With so many teams participating in organised competitions, there are a multitude of Coaches, Team officials and Coordinators who freely give up hour after hour to ensure the games are played weekly.

I take this opportunity to 'shout out' my sincere thanks to these volunteers for their dedicated service to the Club. Unfortunately, there are others within the organisation who believe it is a'a free ride' and rely on these volunteers to do most of the heavy lifting. It's time for them to realise club sport is a team effort and its part of your responsibility to support the club socially and by volunteering support for game day management and fund-raising activities.

Unfortunately, our A Grade Men's team had a poor season winning only five games. As a result, we will be playing in Division 3 in 2024. This is a huge wakeup call and everyone needs to ensure we work hard prior to the season starting to support the Football programme. We need a positive response from supporters, members, and players to 'lift the bar' in all areas of the club. Team Managers, Umpires, Water people, Committee members, bar helpers, BBQ workers, etc. are volunteers who can save the club 'Big' money by offering weekly support.

The other Senior Men's teams all played in the finals and did the club proud. Our D Grade team playing in C7 won the premiership and finished the season undefeated.

Our C Grade team were defeated by R.O.C.S in the Grand Final. The highlight of the season has been the number of young players who have successfully made the transition to senior football. Many players their 1st A Grade games, while the majority played in our B Grade and C Grade teams. Congratulations to all involved in the development of these young players and it must be noted that by sheer numbers we managed to field a fifth team who played in C8. The A Grade Women were promoted to Division 1 this season and were certainly very competitive in making the final series. Lots of hard work by Tim Dunbar (Coach), Janine Vella and Zen Elmassih (Football Directors) to ensure this programme maintained the standards set last year. The B Grade Women's team had plenty of support and gave lots of girls the opportunity to play football for the first time – Thank you Simon Barnes for coaching this group.

The Netball Club continued to grow in numbers and continue to provide an outstanding Junior programme. They are currently in the process of seeking funding and help to re-surface the Mitchell Oval – Henley High School courts. Deb Sanders, Dwayne Illies and their committee work tirelessly to ensure the success of the Club.

Our Junior Football programme is still flourishing with Micah Williams, Craig Hermann and Robyn Casey overseeing the programme. All together we have over 640 young people playing and enjoying a game each week. The Juniors are using local primary schools for training sessions and games. Henley High School also provides another ground to use and finally through the hard work and perseverance of our Club Chairman Paul Caica the new lights were completed in April.

It is fabulous to see the number of past players whose children are now involved in all our junior programmes.

Off the field all sections of the club have continued to work tirelessly to maintain the administration of such a big organisation. I take this opportunity to thank the Senior Committee. At times it seems the same old faces, but they get the job done! Congratulations to Janine Vella (Ron Ettridge Club Champion Award Recipient) and all other Club special award recipients.

Welcome to the younger brigade who joined the old boys this year to inject new life on match days for the 35's.

Final thanks go to Tom, Helen, and Kathleen for coordinating the bar and canteen throughout what proves to be a long season. Their young staff do a terrific job in providing a service to our players and members.

As this is my final year as President, I wish to thank all who have supported me in this role. The Henley Football and Netball Club holds a special place in my heart, and I've made many friends throughout the journey. It never ceases to amaze me the great work that is achieved by the many genuine people who make up the Shark's family. The Club will continue to grow and be a special place for the multitude of members, players and supporters who are committed to making it the best club it can be. Coaches Season Summary:

Luke McCracken was appointed Senior Coach of the A Grade and Adrian Rugolo his assistant with Greg Hawke.

Pre-season commenced in mid-November at Henley High School. There was a sense of excitement around the group early pre-season and participation was high. As pre-season went on feedback from players was training was easy and there was not enough structured training around game plan and a lot of standing around. Attendances were very good with a good mixture of senior players and lots of young men aspiring to play in the senior team for the first time. Recruits Patrick Hillard Sam Liambis, Noah Hannagan, Lucas Foenander and Ryan Johnson were prominent. Ben Currie, Corey Gray and Dylan Fry returned to the club while Michael Gautesen came out of retirement.

There were some great initiatives brought in around mental health and player wellbeing. Groups were put in place with a leader of each group put in charge of checking in and reporting back. There were also some surveys filled in each week which was led by Ben Lodge who did a great job in this space. The season started in late April against Edwardstown and unfortunately it wasn't the start we needed with a narrow loss. Things continued to be disappointing until a great win against Adelaide Uni in Round 6. On field players struggled to adjust to the new game plan. The Sharks had found some momentum and had wins against Athelstone and Salisbury North in the following two rounds.

It was with great anticipation that we travelled to North Haven with Michael Gautesen playing his 200th game. Sadly, on a slippery, windy ground we went down by one point. The second half of the season started with a gutsy win against Edwardstown but wins were scarce from then until a magnificent 56 point win over North Haven in the last game. We will lament a wasted season and the fact we have been relegated to Division 3 for the 2024 season.

Full credit to the senior leadership group – James Lean, Tom Pillion, Liam Martin, Tim Broadbent, Corey Gray and Patrick Hillard. They kept the playing group together and maintained a competitive spirit throughout a tough season. The most pleasing aspect of the season was the high number of young players we have throughout the three top teams. Coaches Season Summary:

Despite the extremely disappointing finish to the year in the grand final, our Henley C Grade side remained the 'team to beat' throughout the entire minor round. With 17 wins out of 18 games, we came into the grand final with extremely high expectations. However, having such a dominant minor round meant that we rarely got to develop our ability to respond to high levels of pressure, which ultimately cost us a premiership.

32 points

Our team included seven 'first year' players which makes our performance quite extraordinary and demonstrates a clear pathway for Henley Juniors into Senior Football at Henley Sharks.

Our extremely young team has most definitely benefitted from a finals campaign and has produced a hunger for this group of young Sharks to strive for finals success in years to come. I am really excited to see how far the members of this group will go in our footy club and beyond over the next few years. Our average age on gf day was 20 years and 9 months (an average of 61 senior games as compared to ROC with 112).

Highlights of our season included:

- 17 wins in the minor season (average margin + 78 pts)
- Over 300 goals kicked in 18 games
- 7 first year players make GF team
- Daniel Wilksch leading C2 goalkicker
- Fantastic development of mateship!

Having the opportunity for C grade to regularly train with other senior teams will continue to push this group of developing players to higher standards of football. Our team generally played fast, aggressive football which relied on running and switching the ball laterally to expose teams. With continued development of these tactics the depth of our football club will be a significant strength for years to come.

Our senior leaders in the team: Daniel Wilksch. Luke Wilksch and Adam Mallen, plus Jordan Chandler later in the year, worked extremely well to build teams across the lines that became accountable to the rest of the team. This sharing of knowledge and upskilling of younger players was also a highlight of our season. Off field, Gary once again worked tirelessly to support the coaching of the C grade as well as often doing the running on Saturday. There was also great support from Greg Hawke and the B Grade staff as well as Simon Hardy. Nick Godlevsky supported again as Team manager for most of the season which was a fantastic help to Gary and I, and Dave Haskard also volunteered for most of the year to be our Game Day Official. Finally, Doug and Chris's efforts every week as trainers must be commended. Often first to arrive at the games with a car full of equipment, they treated our C graders like A grade footy players!

Moving forward into 2024, a season which we would already expect to win, our challenges as a team will include:

- Building the capacity to endure pressure in, what will be another dominant season
- Continuing the development of tactical play and individual fitness and skill (especially when we are so dominant)
- Continuing the development of off-field relationships and commitment to the club
- Finding consistent volunteers for critical positions such as team manager and GDO
- Balancing the structure of training to allow developing players in C Grade to train with all senior players

Season Review:

Preseason numbers were good, and we had a total of 34 to 40 U13 Boys Mid- February like the previous year in the U12 age group. The pre-season was run as one group with identification of development improvement in the whole squad identifying 30 players capable of playing Div 1 for their footy out of a squad of 47.

There was a total of 32 U12 boys play in the Div 1 team all playing 2 or more games in the Div 1 team. A roster type of plan was communicated to the players and parents and players were matched to opposition teams that suited their development also. Both Div 1 and Div 4 teams were aligned with the basic game plan as both teams had limited tall players. Player individual plans were also set to ensure that development was tailored to the players best interest when placing in positions in Div 1 and Div 4. This was worked out with Mark Lambert the Div 4 Coach as the approach was what was best for the individual's football at the time.

It was identified that there were approximately 16 midfielders that needed development time in the midfield so a 4-group midfield rotation plan was set up. Rotations in Div 1 occurred every 6 minutes with 2 players rotating in the front half and 2 players rotating in the in the back half.

The Div 1 team played an exciting attacking style of football that attacked the middle of the ground and moved the ball fast. Basic transition from the back line to the open side of the ground was also introduce to this age group. The Div 1 team finished on top of the ladder after the home and away season and only lost the first game of the season. The Div 1 boys played very much as a selfless team all year and were a very team orientated group. The boys performed well winning the first final heading straight into the grand final against Tea Tree Gully winning 12:11 83 to 4:5 29 after narrowly losing to them back in Round 1. The Grand Final was a close game and the U13 Div 1 boys started slow but finished strong but although having more of the football and inside 50s were not able to win the game. The Div 1 U13 Boys lost the Grand Final to Walkerville 6:4 40 to 4:8 32.

The Div 4 was also successful in making finals what was great that the whole squad again got to experience finals football again although were not fortunate enough to win and were beaten in the first game. The two divisions I feel certainly works for player development at this level as was seen in the previous year with the Div 1 and Div 3 U12s in 2022.

The learnings we need to consider for U13s from a club point from this year were as follows:

- Preseason Skills there is an enormous range of skills at U13 level and those that trained with the summer skills sessions improved more than those that did not participate.
- The roster situation worked well with the boys in Div 1 knowing that there were 32 players who could potentially improve their football by playing in a higher Div 1 competition.
- Training with the preparation of game situations where to run based on positions with the parents assisting was especially important and assisted players in setting up for stoppages, kick ins, and ball movement around the ground again.
- As there were 32 players that can play Div 1 and this is likely to remain similar in 2024 as players in this age group all develop at different rates, I think that keeping both squads training together in the preseason and 1 night a week in the normal season is beneficial for this group going forward.

I would like to thank Mark Lambert for his work with coaching the Div 4 team and supporting the whole group of U13s. Mark and I discussed weekly the players in both teams to ensure we had the best fit for individuals and this assisted with the movement of the players between the teams so we could improve both areas of their games and understand their state of mind to build player confidence.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank Alex Crisa (Assistant Coach) who has fantastic football knowledge, assisted with trainings and was exceptional at managing rotations on game day to ensure players were involved equally in games that were one sided and helped with player development. I would also like to thank Kristen Rawlings who helped on game days on the bench to assist with building players game knowledge and confidence. Brett Burton and James Black were great in their assistance with being the Runners on game days and sharing knowledge in games working with individuals to help their development also. To add to the thank you list I would like to include Andrew Kemp and Andrew Beersworth were all great in assisting with training with the boys all year.

I would also like to extend my thanks to Kirsty Rawlings, Aaron Tuckfield, Kirsty Ross, Phil Ross, and Nikki Foureur who were exceptional team managers and coordinators with their organisation and communication not only on game days but also with many other activities throughout the year. We were also very fortunate to have a great group of parents always willing to help which I think is fantastic for the whole U13 group.

Season Review:

We started pre season with 48 players , 6 of those were new players. The other 42 players had played at the club but half of these players had never played football together. So pre season was about getting to know each other to start with.

During pre season it was noticeable to me that there were boys there that took their football seriously and for others it was a place to have a kick muck around and have a bit of fun. After Christmas we introduced a second training session for those boys that wanted to take their football seriously while still having fun. This was a squad of about 28. These training sessions for myself were much easier to manage.

Going into the season I didn't realise until we started playing games that we didn't have a lot of height and for the first half of the season the boys still were getting to know each other and how each individual played the game.

As the season went on we played players in positions where we thought it would be best for their development. Doing this was successful as I believe there was a vast improvement in the second half of the season with players playing in the same position from week to week they seemed to gel better and learn how to play that position rather than getting thrown around so to speak.

With players coming on and off the bench during the quarter, I feel didn't work as the quarters were 15mins long, so the players only had 7mins on the field, and sometimes it wasn't long enough to get a kick. At u12 level the boys can only kick 30 metres and when under pressure only really 20 metres. When we changed it to a whole quarter sitting on the bench then a whole quarter on the field playing this gave the player more time to get involved in the game and was much better for the players development and also easier to manage.

We ended up playing around 32 players in the div 1 team which I thought was a good outcome. Thanks to Bash coming on board coaching the div 3 team we spoke every week about how certain players were going which assisted in the movement of players from div 3 to div 1.

Nicole Jones was excellent as a team manager not only did she manage the team but at a short time during the start of the season she had to manage myself, so a big thankyou to her.

A big thing that this group has to get better at is their skills, mainly kicking !! I thought we lacked that the most comparing to other teams.

There was no question about the boys endeavour, they tried really, really hard. If we can sharpen our skills up and be cleaner with the ball , the group will be very competitive in the season of 24. A couple of tall players would certainly help as well :)


